



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this [plan](#) (called the [premium](#)) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	For PCP-referred benefits: \$0 individual/ \$0 family. For self-referred benefits: \$250 individual/ \$500 family.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Deductible does not apply to PCP-referred benefits or prescription drugs . Only self-referred benefits are subject to an overall deductible .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	Yes. \$100 for Durable Medical Equipment coverage. There are no other specific deductibles .	You must pay all of the costs for these services up to the specific deductible amount before this plan begins to pay for these services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	For medical expenses: \$5,000 individual/ \$10,000 family. For prescription drug expenses: \$1,600 individual/ \$3,200 family. For the 2017 coverage period only, out-of-pocket medical expenses incurred during the 18-month period 1/1/17-6/30/18 will apply toward this limit.	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , balance-billing charges, out-of-network expenses and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .

<p>Will you pay less if you use a network provider?</p>	<p>Yes. BlueChoice. See www.anthem.com or call 1-800-438-9672 for a list of network providers.</p>	<p>This plan uses a provider network. You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network. You will pay the most if you use an out-of-network provider, and you might receive a bill from a provider for the difference between the provider's charge and what your plan pays (balance billing). Be aware, your network provider might use an out-of-network provider for some services (such as lab work). Check with your provider before you get services.</p>
<p>Do you need a referral to see a specialist?</p>	<p>Yes. For PCP-referred benefits your PCP must provide a referral for services from a specialist. No referral is required for self-referred benefits.</p>	<p>This plan will pay some or all of the costs to see a specialist for covered services but only if you have a referral before you see the specialist.</p>

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you don't have [Minimum Essential Coverage](#) for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your [plan](#) doesn't meet the [Minimum Value Standards](#), you may be eligible for a [premium tax credit](#) to help you pay for a [plan](#) through the [Marketplace](#).

Peg is Having a Baby

(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

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In this example, Joe would pay:

Copayments	\$388
Coinsurance	\$346
<i>What isn't covered</i>

The total Joe would pay is	\$8

Mia's Simple Fracture

(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)
