Curriculum:

Londonderry High School is a comprehensive, public high school accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Students are encouraged to take courses from a variety of subject areas to fulfill their 24 credit graduation requirement. Most subject areas offer advanced placement, honors, and college preparatory courses, as well as specialized programs for students with learning disabilities and special needs. Students participate in an array of interscholastic sports and extra-curricular activities.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- * All students are required to take CP Freshman Science
- * There is no Honors science offering at the freshman level.
- * Honors courses are only available to Freshmen in English and mathematics; Honors offerings are available to sophomores in English, mathematics, and science.
- * All Honors courses are designed to be as rigorous as the AP course in that subject area (if applicable). Honors Foreign Language classes act as pre-requisites to the AP classes
- * No AP course can be taken as a substitute for Honors English 11 or CP English 11; AP Literature and Composition and AP Language and Composition are electives.
- * Beginning with the Class of 2019, AP US History will be available to Sophomores in place of CP US History.
