

SCHOOL BOARD OFFICERS

The Officers of the Londonderry School Board shall be an Executive Secretary and four elected officers. The elected officers shall be a Chair, a Vice-Chair, a Secretary, and a treasurer; they shall be elected at the annual organizational meeting to serve until the next organizational meeting or until their term expires. Any vacancy in the four elected offices may be filled at any meeting of the Board provided that all members of the board have been notified at least three days prior to the meeting that the vacancy will be filled at that meeting. The Superintendent shall be the Board's Executive Secretary ex-officio.

CHAIR:

The Board member who is elected to the chair shall preside at all meetings, and shall have the right to vote on all matters before the School Board; shall consult with the superintendent on authority to sign contracts and other instruments approved by the Board in its name and behalf, shall be a member ex-officio of all committees and subcommittees appointed by the Board, and shall have such other powers and Duties as the Board may from time to time determine.

VICE-CHAIR:

Shall assume all powers and duties of the Chair in the case of absence, disability or temporary relinquishment on the part of the Board member elected to the Chair, and shall have such other powers and duties as the Board may from time to time determine.

SECRETARY:

Shall assume all powers and duties of the Chair in the case of absence, disability or temporary relinquishment on the part of both Chair and Vice-Chair, and shall have such other powers and duties as the Board may from time to time determine.

TREASURER:

Shall have such powers and duties as the Board may from time to time determine, and in the case of temporary relinquishment on the part of the Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary may preside at Board meetings.

RELINQUISHMENT OF THE CHAIR TO PRESERVE IMPARTIALITY:

It is the desire of the School Board that its presiding officer be impartial.

Therefore the Board member holding the Chair is encouraged to temporarily relinquish it whenever he or she feels strongly committed to one side or another of a question under debate, or whenever he or she wishes to make a motion.
